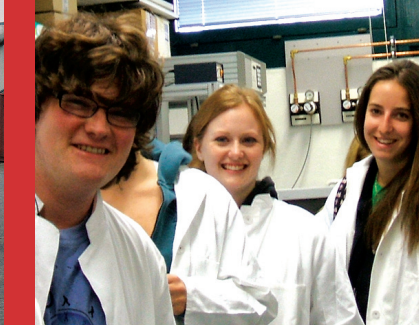

EXAMPLES OF RECENT FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS:

• McIntire School of Commerce, University of Virginia, European Business Strategy

DIS provides one component of a broader faculty-led summer program for MBA students. Students learn how business is done differently in Europe through visits to companies and DIS faculty from the business world – covering topics including EU integration & business impact; economics & the Euro; Europeanization of business management; business strategy & corporate social responsibility. DIS also provides housing for the 26 students and visiting faculty. Since 2009.

• Carleton College New Media in Copenhagen

New Media Roadtrip is a ten-week off-campus study program exploring and making new media in New York and major European cities. The group visits a wide variety of

artists, institutions and exhibitions presenting contemporary art and new media. Students bring laptops and digital cameras, and produce new media projects along the way. The 2010-11 program will visit Paris, Barcelona and Copenhagen. DIS will provide housing for the 25 students and 1 faculty, group airport pick-up & orientation, classroom, guest lecture, field studies, welcome and/or concluding dinner.

• Rhode Island School of Design Interior Architecture

The Rhode Island School of Design (RISD) requires their incoming advanced standing Master of Interior Architecture students to participate in the DIS 9-credit summer interior architecture program. Studio and lecture courses are co-led by RISD and DIS faculty. The program, offered each summer, is open to both RISD and other qualified interior architecture students. Since 2006.

• Union College Comparative Health Care

A group of Union College students earn 3 credits in the DIS summer course Health Care in Northern Europe as one component of a broader faculty-led program, National Health Systems. Students visit an academic hospital, a rehabilitation center, a nursing home, and an outpatient clinic. The students examine models of health care in Canada, Great Britain and Denmark. Since 2009.

• **Visit Carlsberg or SAS** by Niels Hald, Secretary General and CEO, The Danish Brewers Association and The Danish Softdrink Association. Learn about their business model & strategy, and how the EU impacts their business.

• **Psychology of Happiness** by Helle Harnisch. Cand. pæd. psyk., Danish University of Education. Contributing practitioner at the VIA Institute of Positive Psychology. Study recent psychological research in the rapidly expanding field of Positive Psychology.

• **Migration & Identity in a European Setting** by Jacob Lindgaard Ph.D. Gain insights into how cultural, ethnic and national identity are constructed and negotiated in a European setting.
